A better goal would be "improve pacing of speech during class presentations" because it is specific and uses positive language. T - Timely - Make sure to incorporate time-related markers for the goals. Time is tangible, measurable, and specific. Some examples of these might be: Work on speech therapy flashcards for 15 minutes 4 days a week

### Make S.M.A.R.T. Speech Therapy Goals: Specific, Measurable ...

Given an object or picture, STUDENT will use 2 words to indicate recurrence of an object (e.g., "more cracker") with 80% accuracy in 4 out of 5 opportunities. Given an object or picture, STUDENT will use 2 words that contain an adjective and a noun (e.g., "big bear") with 80% accuracy in 4 out of 5 opportunities.

SMART goals: time-bound. The final element of SMART goals is making them time-bound. But what does it mean? It essentially means setting yourself a deadline for achieving your goal. For example, 'learn 20 French verbs by the end of next week'.

Step 4: Write your goal and place it somewhere visible! We can have super fabulous goals, but they're kind of meaningless if we can't remember them! I like writing my top three goals on sticky notes and putting them on my computer as a reminder. Step 5: Ask for help from other speech therapists.

With that said, let's dive into some examples of goals that are SMART goals. Example #1: Saving Money. Let's say that your goal is to start saving more money. Now, in and of itself, this isn't a SMART goal, but it can easily be modified so that it is one. For example: You could say that you want to save \$10,000 a year for the next ten years.

As school based SLPs, many of us are required to write a professional goal for ourselves each year. In my district under the Danielson model, we call it an "Individual Growth Plan," while others may call it "Professional Development Goals," "Professional Goal Setting," "Professional Learning Plan," or something similar.

### Setting Professional Goals as an SLP

When writing goals keep in mind that goals are supposed to be SMART: specific, measureable, attainable, relevant and timely. A pet peeve of mine are goals that say "the client will improve his receptive/expressive skills." These are not SMART: First of all they are not specific, but more, importantly, there is no measurable component in them.

### Tricks to Take the Pain Out of Writing Treatment Goals

Goals are the basis for all speech and language therapy treatment. Without a clear goal or plan, therapy can appear confusing and irrelevant, leading to a lack of motivation and disengagement 1 . Often however, the process of setting speech therapy goals for aphasia can be much harder than it first appears.
